14 Jesus said to his disciples, 'Do not be sad or afraid. Believe in God and also believe in me. <sup>2</sup> There are many rooms in my Father's house. I will go now so that I can prepare a place for you there. If it was not true, I would not have told you this. <sup>3</sup> After I have prepared a place for you, I will return. Then I will take you so that you will be with me. You will be where I am...<sup>27</sup> I will go away but I will give you a gift of peace. It is mine to give and yours to keep. It is not like a gift that this world gives. Do not let yourselves be sad. Do not be afraid. <sup>28</sup> You heard me say to you, "I will go away, but I will return to you." (EEV)
